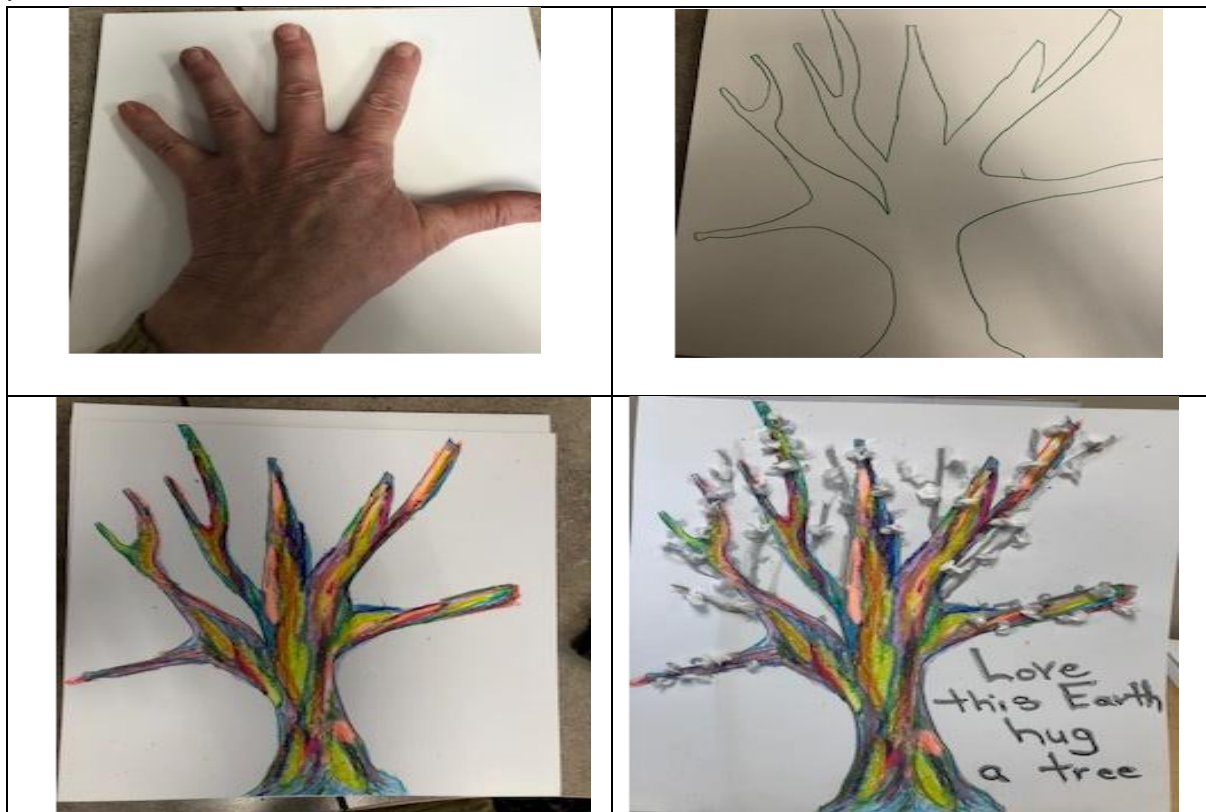

We will be creating a beautiful Rainbow eucalyptus tree. This is a stunning, brightly colored tree that grows mainly in the rainforest. The tree produces white flowers and has a leaf that produces a fragrant oil.



1-On a piece of paper, lay your hand down with the fingers spread out wide and close to the top of the paper. You can draw around your hand or just try making lines on one side of each finger. When you take your hand away, add more lines to make branches. Color the tree with different colors of bright reds, oranges, blues, pinks, and purples that create an amazing rainbow.

2-Make leaves of gray or silver in the branches. You could even use a bit of tin foil. Then add bunches of white flowers with tissue paper or regular tissue. Roll small pieces between your fingers to make balls or twist small squares into bows. Glue this to the branches. Add your own Earth Day message and share with a neighbor or friend. Or just hang it up in a window to remind us all of the wonders of our vast Earth that need to be treasured and protected.
